Many people experience information overload when navigating the Internet for information on addiction. Here are some websites developed by the ADAI Library to help users find and select information.

Substance Abuse Screening & Assessment Instruments

Web site and database with 700+ measures used in AOD research and clinical practice. Includes instruments with demonstrated validity and clinical utility as well as new instruments. Records contain developer contact information, a brief description, populations, citations to supporting literature, and a link to the instrument if available online, or ordering information if it is not online.

CTN Dissemination Library http://ctndisseminationlibrary.org

The CTN Dissemination Library is a digital repository of articles, manuals, presentations, and other documents produced by the National Drug Abuse Treatment Clinical Trials Network. It provides CTN members and the public with a single point of access to research findings and other information about the CTN that has been approved for dissemination to the public. The web site includes records for each article, or document in the Library as well as for each protocol and Node. Compiled by ADAI Library with funding from NIDA.

ATOD Serials Database http://lib.adai.washington.edu/salisserials.htm

Searchable database of over 400 journals, newsletters, and monograph series in the addictions field, with links to journal websites & online access when available. Quick-searches available according to focus area categories (e.g. Prevention,

Criminal Justice, Biomedical, etc.), as well as whether they are peer-reviewed research journals, and those that are free online. Updated regularly.

Evidence-Based Practices for Treating Substance Use Disorders http://adai.washington.edu/ebp

Web site and database with 40+ EBPs. Each EBP record contains developer contact, brief description, therapy manuals, training, populations and drug problems studied, citations to supporting literature, and links to more information. Other features of the web site are Literature Reviews and Web Resources related to evidence-based treatment. The purpose of the EBP database is to assist treatment providers and policy makers in evaluating and selecting science-based treatment practices. Compiled by ADAI and NFATTC, with funding from DASA.
